Portland Community Education Foundation—Applicants must be citizens of Portland and seeking higher education at an accredited college, university or technical school. Students must have a 3.0, 95% attendance rate, 30 hours of community/volunteer service, and participation in at least 1 extra-curricular, economic need. Applications in Guidance.
